## Memphis Showboats roster takes shape after first round of player dispersal process



Teams each protected 42 foundational players, and selected up to 20 from their respective con-

ARLINGTON, TX - January 8, 2024 – The United Football League, the premier spring football league, has announced the results of its initial player dispersal process.

Each remaining XFL Conference and USFL Conference team protected 42 foundational players from its 2023 roster. Each team in each of the XFL and USFL Conferences then selected up to 20 players from the rosters of teams from their previous league that will not be moving forward in 2024. That

The Memphis Showboats used their full allotment of 20 selections from other USFL teams not moving forward in 2024, giving them a total of 62 players after Friday. Included in those 62 players are 31 on the offensive side of the ball, 29 on defense and two specialists. Of the 20 Showboats selected from previous USFL teams, 10 came from the New Orleans Breakers, five

from the New Jersey Generals

and two each from the Pittsburgh
