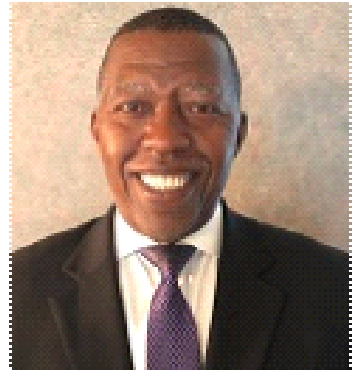

Glover goes back-to-back to win FedEx St. Jude Championship at TPC

MEMPHIS- The first round of the PGA playoffs returned to Memphis at TPC Southwind from August 10-13. After winning the prior week, Lucas Glover survived a one-hole play-off on Sunday to claim victory.

The tournament featured the top 70 players in the Tour standings with only 50 making it to the next playoff round in Chicago



this week. The win moves Glover to 4th in the playoff standings. He led most of the Tournament from day one and entered Sunday's final round with a one-shot lead.

Glover had been going through putting woes for nearly a decade. He recently caged putters and styles which seems to work well of him. "I had no control over my facilities" he said, "and that was difficult to understand and difficult to work with."

When he and Taylor Moore reach 18 on Sunday in the play-off, one player would win. Moore missed a 12 foot putt after Glover had tapped in to give Glover the victory.

MEMPHIS, Tenn. – University of Memphis junior Seth Henigan was named one of 33 quarterbacks to the Manning Award Preseason Watch List, sponsored by the Allstate Sugar Bowl, on Tuesday. Henigan was also named to the Davey O'Brien Preseason Watch List and the Maxwell

In 2022, Henigan completed 286-of-446 passes for 22 touchdowns, while also rushing for 289 yards and four scores. The junior will be the youngest third year starting quarterback (20 years old) in the FBS this coming season.

For his career, Henigan ranks fifth all-time in Memphis history in attempts (839), completions (521), passing yards (6,893), passing touchdowns (47) and completion percentage (.621).

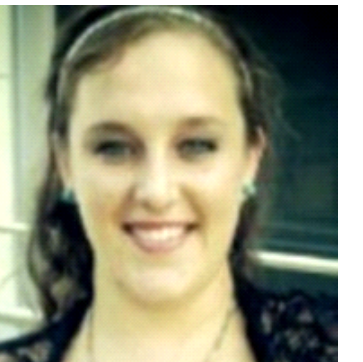

NFL partners with NFHS to develop officiating skills in youth and high school football students

N.Y., N.Y. - As part of the ongoing partnership between the National Football League and the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS), a new initiative to increase participation in and recognition of high school football officials will be piloted with seven NFL clubs during the 2023 football season. The NFL has identified three major areas of

support – recognition, mentorship, and campaign support – and the participating clubs will work with surrounding NFHS member state high school associations to fulfill the initiative's mission.

The partnership with NFHS has helped us better understand high school football participation trends and been an incredible resource for all 32 clubs", said

Roman Oben, NFL Vice President of Football Development. "We can now promote the officials as well as the athletes on the field."

The seven NFL clubs participating in this initiative and the states they are representing are the Atlanta Falcons (Alabama/Georgia), Buffalo Bills (New York), Cincinnati Bengals (Ohio), Cleveland Browns (Ohio), Las

Vegas Raiders (Nevada/Utah), the New York Giants (New York) and the New York Jets (New Jersey).

In affiliation with respective state associations, the participating NFL clubs will recognize youth and high school officials across their states in the months of September, October, and November. Recipients will be highlighted for their demonstration of

Jaylon Allen named to Lombardi Award Watchlist

MEMPHIS, Tenn. – University of Memphis defensive lineman Jaylon Allen was named to the Lombardi Award Watchlist on Tuesday, the Lombardi Award, in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Houston, announced. The Lombardi Award goes annually to the college football offensive or defensive lineman who exemplifies the character and discipline of NFL Hall of Fame Head Coach Vince Lombardi in addition to outstanding performance and ability.

In 2022, Allen started all 13 games for the Tigers, totaling 58 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, five sacks, one fumble recovery, one interception, six quarterback hurries and one pass breakup on the year, leading the team in tackles for loss and sacks.

For his career, Allen has played in 47 games with 110 tackles, 18.5 tackles for loss, 11 sacks, one interception, three passes defended, one forced fumble and two fumble recoveries.
