

Memphis Tigers hang on by paws to defeat Rice U.

MEMPHIS, November 9, 2024-The Memphis Tigers returned home to Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium on Saturday November 9 to take on conference fore Rice Owls. After a disappointing loss to UTSA the week before, the Tigers held on for a much needed 27-20 victory.

The start of the game had Tiger fans a bit nervous as the offense sputtered. The

Tigers failed to score in the 1st quarter. Rice in turn kicked 2 field goals to make the score 6-0 Rice after one.

The Tigers finally got on the

board in the middle of the 2nd quarter when quarterback Seth Henigan hit Brandon Doyle on a 9-yard touchdown pass. The Tigers struck again in the 2nd on a 10-yard touchdown run from Mario Anderson. Rice responded with a touchdown of their own when E J Sykes hit Matt Sykes on a 27-yard touchdown pass.

The Tigers tacked on a field goal

to make the score 17-13 going

into the half.

After a scoreless 3rd quarter from both teams, the Tigers added a touchdown and a field goal in the 4th quarter. Rice scored a late 4th quarter touchdown to bring the score to 27-20. Time ran out on the Owls' comeback attempt and the Tigers held on for the win.

The Tigers have 2 more games left in the season. They will face rival UAB next week at home. They then go to New Orleans to play number 25 Tulane. Though they are all but out of any chance to play in the AAC Championship, they can still salvage another 10-win season. That would be a milestone that has happened very few times in the program's history.

Arizona quarterback KYLER MURRAY completed 22 of 24 attempts (91.7 percent) for 266 yards and one touchdown for a 126.7 passer rating. He also rushed for 21 yards and two touchdowns.

TN Titans to host Minnesota Vikings in Nissan Stadium

Tennessee Titans (2-7) vs. Minnesota Vikings (7-2) Sunday, Nov. 17, 2024 • Noon CST • Nissan Stadium • Nashville, Tenn. • TV: CBS

Kickoff at Nissan Stadium (capacity 69,143) is scheduled for noon CST on Sunday, Nov. 17.

NASHVILLE, Tenn- The Vikings are scheduled to make their third all-time appearance at Nissan Stadium and their first since 2016. The most recent Titans-Vikings matchup in the regular season was at Minnesota on Sept. 27, 2020. In a game played without fans in attendance due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Titans edged the hosts by a final score of 31-30.

This week's festivities also will include the Titans' annual Salute to Service, a league-wide initiative to show gratitude for the sacrifices made by the military community.

This week's game will be regionally televised on CBS, including Nashville affiliate WTVF NewsChannel 5, as well as on Paramount+ in the Nashville market. The broadcast team includes play-by-play announcer

Quarterback Will Levis was back in the starting lineup for the first time since Oct. 13 after nursing a right shoulder injury. His statistics at Los Angeles included 175 yards and two touchdowns on 18-of-23 passing. He established a career high with a 78.3 completion percentage, and his 127.4 passer rating ranked second in his career in a game with at least 20 attempts.

went to wide receiver Calvin Ridley. They connected on a 41yard touchdown on the offense's first drive of the game, and they added a 15-yarder in the fourth quarter. It was Ridley's seventh career game with two or more Zone carry all Titans action actouchdown receptions and his first such game since joining the Titans as an unrestricted free agent during the offseason.

Both of Levis' touchdown passes

In the past four weeks, Ridley has 23 receptions for 342 yards. His yardage total ranks fourth in the NFL during that span.

Through 10 weeks of the NFL season, the Titans rank first in total defense, allowing 273.6 yards per game. The Titans also rank first in passing defense, yielding only 156.7 yards per contest through the air.
