Memphis Tigers fall to SMU on Senior Day ending hope for the AAC Championship

MEMPHIS- The Memphis Tigers fell to the SMU Mustangs on Saturday November 18 at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium 38-34. The loss ended all hopes the Tigers had of playing in the AAC Championship. The Tigers came into the game with an 8-2 record and at the top of the Conference. However, they have lost to the two teams at the top, including Tulane.


