Eight finalists named for Art Rooney Award; Winner will be revealed at Super Bowl

NEW YORK — The eight finalists for the 2023 Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award have been named, the NFL recently announced. The award is presented each year to an NFL player who best demonstrates the qualities of on-field sportsmanship, including fair play, respect for the game and opponents, and integrity in competition.

The winner will be announced as part of the NFL Honors before Super Bowl LVIII.

The finalists, featuring four players from each conference, are defensive end Maxx Crosby (Las Vegas), linebacker Khalil Mack (Los Angeles Chargers), linebacker C.J. Mosley (New York Jets) and guard Kevin Zeitler (Baltimore) in the AFC, and safety Budda Baker (Arizona), fullback Kyle Juszczyk (San Francisco), quarterback Dak Prescott (Dallas) and linebacker Bobby Wagner (Seattle) in the NFC.

A panel of former players from the NFL Legends Community selected the eight finalists from the 32 NFL club nominees. The panel is comprised of Warrick Dunn, Larry Fitzgerald, Curtis Martin and Leonard Wheeler. The eight finalists will be listed on the Pro Bowl ballot under the NFL Sportsmanship Award category.

"I have enjoyed the process of learning about the men that have been nominated for the Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award," said NFL Legend Larry Fitzgerald. "Each nominee has displayed the character of Mr. Rooney's legacy. The award represents teamwork, competitiveness, hard work and integrity, while on the field."

The award was created in 2014 in honor of the late founding owner of the Pittsburgh Steelers and Pro Football Hall of Famer Art Rooney, Sr.

Head football coach Ryan Silverfield announces 34 sign intent letters for 2024 season

MEMPHIS, Tenn. Dec. 20, 2023 – University of Memphis head football coach Ryan Silverfield announced on Wednesday the signing of 34 student-athletes to National Letters of Intent to play for the Tigers beginning in 2024.

The class includes 14 high school seniors as well as 20 transfers. The group includes 16 offensive players, 15 defensive players, two specialists and one athlete.

The 2023 early signing day period class includes five players each from Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi and Texas, four from Tennessee, two from South Carolina and one each from North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Idaho, Maine and Louisiana, as well as one from Australia.

Among the signees are nine offensive linemen, five linebackers, five defensive linemen, five defensive backs, four wide receivers, two running backs, one quarterback, one kicker, one punter and one athlete.

David Jones named to the American Athletic Conf. Honor Roll for third time

IRVING, Texas, Dec. 26, 2023—Senior forward David Jones has been named to the American Athletic Conference Honor Roll for a third time after a big week on the hardwood. It's his fourth weekly honor from the league office this season.

Jones continued to be unstoppable in wins over No. 22 Virginia and Vanderbilt, averaging 27.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.5 assists per game for the Tigers.

The St. John's transfer shot 51.9 percent from the field, hitting 14-of-27 field goals and connecting on 6-of-9 attempts from 3-point range (66.7%). He was also a force in getting to the free throw line where he converted on 20-of-26 attempts.

Jones led a spirited effort from Memphis last Tuesday in a 77-54 win over the Cavaliers with 26 points and four rebounds while shooting 8-15 from the floor and a perfect 8-8 at the line.

On Saturday, Jones dropped 28 points and nine boards while going 6-12 from the field, 4-6 from long distance and 12-18 at the stripe.

The Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic product leads the AAC in scoring (21.4), ranks second in 3-pointers made (31), fifth in steals per game (2.08) and sixth in 3-point percentage (41.9). He tops the league with eight games of 20-plus points, no one else has more than five.

Nationally, Jones ranks 11th in scoring, 12th in total points (257) and free throws made (72) and 15th in free throws attempted (91)

The No. 19 Tigers (10-2) are back in action Saturday when they host Austin Peay at 6 p.m. on ESPN+. It will be the final contest before Memphis gets going with conference play at Tulsa on January 4.
