The Second Amendment Foundation (SAF) announced the release of a final, long-form video commemorating SAF's 50th anniversary and celebrating the organization's critical work fighting for the right to keep and bear arms.

Starting in late June, SAF released a series of short videos culminating with the release of this long-form history video. Titled "Reflections: Five Decades of SAF's 2A Advocacy," the videos take viewers on a historical journey of SAF, showcasing its commitment to defend, secure and restore the Second Amendment.

There are a total of 19 "Reflections" videos – 18 short- and one long-form video that each offer a unique perspective on the organization's work over the past five decades. The videos are available on SAF's website, YouTube channel and social media platforms.

"This video provides a great avenue to showcase the history of the organization as told by those who have supported us over the past 50 years," said SAF founder and Executive Vice President Alan M. Gottlieb. "The people interviewed in these videos are the members, donors and sup-

proper gun safety protocol. In which case, the revolver could not have discharged a round unintentionally even if it was accidentally dropped or fell," said Lawrence G. Keane, Senior Vice President and General Counsel for NSSF – The Firearm Industry Trade Association.

"Additionally, modern firearms are designed to industry standards to withstand abusive mishandling to prevent them from discharging unintentionally if dropped," Keane added. "A point-blank discharge of Colt .45 round would have caused extensive - and obvious - damage to

Mr. Sheehy's arm and would have required immediate medical attention, possibly including surgery, of the gunshot wound. If Mr. Sheehy were actually shot at Glacier as is alleged, it is unimaginable he would walk out of the hospital just a few hours later. For these reasons, we believe the allegation, as reported by the media, that Tim Sheehy's single action Colt .45 revolver discharged when it fell or was dropped striking him in his arm is false and inaccurate."

Grizzlies sign Jay Huff to a multi-year contract

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Oct. 28, 2024 – The Memphis Grizzlies announced the team signed center Jay Huff to a multi-year contract. Per team policy, terms of the deal were not disclosed.

Huff (7-1, 240) has appeared in three games as a reserve this season and has averaged 13.0 points, 3.3 rebounds and 1.7 blocks in 19.0 minutes while shooting 63.6 percent overall and 57.1 percent from 3-point range after signing a two-way contract with the Grizzlies on July 24. Unselected in the 2021 NBA Draft, Huff has competed in 34 games off the bench and

has averaged 3.3 points and 1.4 rebounds in 6.5 minutes for the Grizzlies, Denver Nuggets, Washington Wizards and Los Angeles Lakers following a four-year collegiate career at Virginia, where he was a member of the Cavaliers' 2019 NCAA championship team.

During the 2022-23 season, he was named the NBA G League Defensive Player of the Year and was selected to the All-NBA G League First Team and NBA G League All-Defensive First Team with Capital City.

Lee Greenwood collaborates with Drew Jacobs on rock version of 'God Bless the U.S.A.' set for download on Friday, November 1

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – "God Bless The U.S.A.", the iconic and beloved patriotic anthem originally recorded by Lee Greenwood and covered countless times over by music industry icons such as Beyonce, and Dolly Parton, is celebrating its 40th anniversary with a never-before-heard twist - Lee Greenwood, at age 82, has teamed up with young viral country artist Drew Jacobs to record a brand new soaring Rock version of the iconic song, further ensuring the anthem remains as important to today's youngest generation of Country music fans as it has for the many generations of the past.

fully transforming them into Billboard chart-topping Rock versions is destined to do the same with his collaborative rendition of "God Bless The U.S.A.," featuring Lee Greenwood on co-lead vocals. Previous Rock renditions released by Jacobs include, "The Thunder Rolls" by Garth Brooks, "God's Country" by Blake Shelton, "Whiskey Lullaby" by Brad Paisley & Alison Krauss and many more.

"This is a big year for God Bless The USA. I have not recorded the song with many people, ever, as I felt like it would be passing the baton to someone else to sing my signature song," says Green-

wood. "However, this rock-version is not something that I would have done on my own. So, I am excited to have fans and fellow patriots hear it, share it, and add it to their playlists."

About Lee Greenwood: Throughout his expansive career, international country music icon Lee Greenwood has earned multiple CMA and ACM Awards, a Grammy Award for Top Male Vocal Performance on "I.O.U." in 1985, and a multitude of other prestigious awards nominations. His discography includes twenty-two studio albums, seven compilation albums, seven No. 1 hits, and thirty-eight singles including songs like "It Turns Me Inside Out," "Ring On Her Finger Time on Her Hands," "She's Lyin'," "I

Don't Mind the Thorns if You're the Rose," "Dixie Road," "Somebody's Gonna Love You," "Going Going Gone," "You Got A Good Love Comin'," among others. His stand-out hit "God
