## TN Titans host Patriots in Nissan Stadium, airing on Fox ...from sports page 1

LAST WEEK AT DETROIT The Titans return to Nissan Stadium to host the Patriots following two consecutive away games and three of their last four contests on the road. Last week they visited Detroit, where they fell by a final score of 52-14.

At Detroit, Titans quarterback Mason Rudolph started his second consecutive game with Will Levis inactive due to a right shoulder injury. Rudolph completed 22 of 38 passes for 266 yards and one touchdown with two interceptions, and he added an 11-yard rushing touchdown. His 266 passing yards ranked fourth in his career.

Rudolph's primary target was wide receiver Calvin Ridley. Ridley's 10 receptions tied his career high, and his 143 receiving yards tied for the third-best total of his career. In the first quarter alone, he had six catches for 118 yards, becoming the Titans' first player with 100 receiving yards in the first quarter since Drew Bennett (124) at Indianapolis on Dec. 5, 2004.

Rudolph's touchdown pass was caught by Nick Westbrook-Ikhine. The five-yard score gave the fifth-year wideout a touchdown grab in three consecutive

games. On defense, the Titans were paced by outside linebacker Arden Key, who recorded a career-high two sacks. Key, who also forced a fumble against the Lions, has three sacks in the past two weeks.

THE PATRIOTS New England is led by head coach Jerod Mayo, who attended the University of Tennessee from 2004 through 2007. He took over the head coaching duties for the Patriots during the 2024 offseason after playing and coaching under previous head coach Bill Belichick.

Patriots rookie and former North Carolina Tar Heels quarterback Drake Maye was the third-overall draft pick in 2024. He has appeared in four games this season with three starts, passing for 564 yards and five touchdowns with two interceptions.

Last week against the AFC East rival New York Jets, Maye departed during the second quarter due to a concussion. Jacoby Brissett entered in relief and helped the Patriots to a 25-22 victory. Rhamondre Stevenson's one-yard touchdown with 22 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter provided the winning margin.

## Showboats acquire quarterback Quinten Dormady in trade with the San Antonio Brahmas; J. Ferguson goes to Brahmas

MEMPHIS, Tenn., October 25, 2024 - The Memphis Showboats have acquired quarterback Quinten Dormady in a trade with the San Antonio Brahmas. Memphis sent outside linebacker Jordan Ferguson to the Brahmas in the trade.

*Dormady helped lead the Brahmas to a conference championship and a berth in the 2024 UFL Championship Game. He saw action in seven regular season games as the Brahmas' signal-caller last season, completing 103-of-173 passes for 1,206 yards, six touchdowns and six interceptions. He was No. 5 in the UFL in passing yards, despite only seeing action in seven of 10 regular season games. Dormady helped lead San Antonio to a No. 3 ranking in passing offense and a No. 4 ranking in total offense in 2024.*

Dormady played for the Orlando Guardians of the XFL in 2023, where he passed for 1,507 yards and 10 touchdowns with five interceptions. He added four rushing TDs for Orlando that season.

Dormady began his collegiate career at Tennessee and also played at Houston before finishing his collegiate career at Central Michigan. With the Chippewas in 2019, Dormady started 10 games, completed 64.6 percent of his passes for 2,312

yards, with 14 touchdowns and nine interceptions. He led CMU to a berth in the MAC Championship game in 2019 and a New Mexico Bowl berth.

The 2025 UFL season will kick off on March 28, 2025, with a 10-week regular season schedule, followed by two conference championship games, and the UFL Championship Game, which is set for June 14, 2025.

## Top student athletes named to Bassmaster High School All-Star Fishing Team for '24

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — Forty-five of the best high school anglers from across the country have been named to the 2024 Bassmaster High School All-State Fishing Team.

The students were selected for the honor based on their success in bass tournament competition, academic achievement and leadership in conservation and community service.

To be considered for the All-State Fishing Team, a student must have been nominated by a parent, coach, teacher or other school official. Students enrolled in grades 10-12 with a current-year grade point average of 2.5 or higher were eligible.

B.A.S.S. received nearly 300 nominations from across 31 states. From these, judges selected 45 student anglers to make the All-State Fishing Team. Additionally, 47 students received Honorable Mentions recognizing them for their tournament success as well as community service and academic achievement.

"Congratulations! This goes to show your efforts on and off the water do not go unnoticed," said Glenn Cale, B.A.S.S. tournament manager for the College, High School and Junior series. "I'm super-proud of you all. This is something to truly be proud of. Be sure to chase all of your dreams, because they do not chase you back."

A second panel of judges will review the nominations of the 45 All-State team members and select the 12 members of the 2024 Bassmaster High School All-American Fishing Team. As in All-State judging, criteria include success in high school fishing tournaments, involvement in conservation efforts and other community service activities.

The 12 finalists will be honored on the most prestigious stage in bass fishing at the 2025 Bass Pro Shops Bassmaster Classic in Fort Worth, Texas March 21-23.
