Liam St. John closes out debut chapter in the Wild Man of the North — *Live in the Wild* with iconic landscapes

From *The Kelly Clarkson Show* at Findlater Castle, to *Cumberland Caverns*, *City of Rocks*, and *Knik Glacier*

June 5, 2026: Roots-rock rambler **Liam St. John** brings his electrifying **Man Of The North** era to a close with the release of *Man Of The North* (Live in the Wild), a live collection of unforgettable performances recorded across three iconic natural landscapes — Findlater Castle in Scotland, City of Rocks in Idaho, and Cumberland Caverns in Tennessee — out now via Big Loud Rock.

After releasing his critically acclaimed debut album *Man Of The North* in September 2025, St. John elevated the release by bringing the songs to life through a series of cinematic performances filmed in the wild. What began with a national television debut on **The Kelly Clarkson Show** from the cliffs of Findlater Castle in Scotland soon evolved into the Cumberland Cave Sessions, City of Rocks Sessions, and, most recently, the Alaska Sessions, collectively drawing over 25 million views across platforms.

St. John unveils the latest iteration of his Alaska Sessions with a stirring live performance of “**Believer**,” shot at Knik Glacier.

At the crossroads of Americana grit and rock-and-roll fire, Liam

St. John has amassed over 100 million global streams across platforms. Up next, St. John will kick off his Year of the Horse headline tour this month in Europe, before returning to the US this summer. sponsible and recovery of the stolen firearms. Additionally, NSSF helps educate firearm retailers on steps they can take to reduce the chance guns will be stolen from them during a burglary or robbery, and in cooperation with ATF, conducts retailer store security seminars, assists retailers with store security audits of their premises and endorses and promotes the use of security products like smash resistant display cases.

The most recently available ATF data shows Operation Secure Store is working. New data from ATF reveals a 60 percent drop in the number of firearms stolen during burglaries and robberies at firearm retailers. That also includes a more than 40 percent drop in the number of incidents. About NSSF: NSSF is the trade association for the firearm industry.
